Responsibilities:

9. Recruit and supervise youth workers, providing training as needed.
10. Meet regularly with youth ministry leaders to pray and discuss upcoming events, challenges, solutions, and praises.
11. Serve as member of Church Leadership Team.
12. Have regular staff meetings with Senior Pastor.
13. Oversee budget and expenditures for the youth ministry.
